A student needs learning accommodations: The Disability Services Office at USCA assists students with physical, psychological, or learning disabilities in their college

experience by integrating on-campus services. They are located in the Student and Educational Support building, room 104, and available at 803-643-6815.

A student is having a difficult time making friends or feels disconnected on campus: Student Affairs website has resources and lists of ways for students to find friends and get involved. The "Presence" platform lists events.

A student is a veteran who needs support or assistance: The Veteran and Military Student Success Center has resources and programs to assist. This office is located in Penland 107and available at 803-643-6767.

A student worker has issues with pay or hiring: Human Resources Assistant Director Melissa Wilson at 803-641-3318 helps students and faculty process paperwork for on-campus positions.

A student is looking for on or off campus work: Career Services is located in Penland 108 and available at 803-641-3440 or careerservices@usca.edu. This office helps students set up Handshake (job listing) accounts; assists with career planning and workshops; and offers guidance and support, such as experiential education (aka internships and other positions) and other tools.

A student has a serious complaint about a professor: Academic Affairs website houses complaint forms for in-class issues.

A student reports issues with bias and/or hate on campus: Direct them to the Community Concerns Response Team (CCRT) website.

A student needs financial aid assistance: Financial Aid is in Penland 102.

A student has an issue with academic records, course enrollment, etc.: Office of the Registrar is in Penland 109 and available at 803-641-3550.

A student ran out of printing money or has difficulty printing: Students get 200 printed pages available each semester. To get more printing funds, students can add to their Carolina Cash account under the Financial Tab on VIP.

A student has money for printing but can't print: Contact the student help desk in the library!

A student has computer issues: The student help desk is in the library. Students *may* borrow laptops or tablets in the library as well. Extended loans are possible with instructor assistance.
